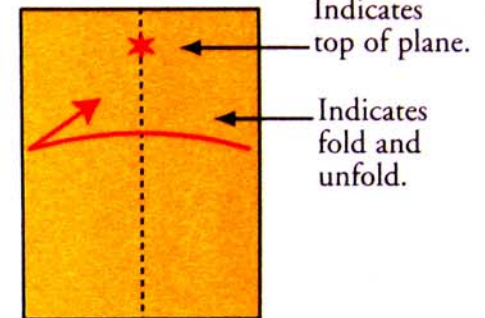


# Folding the Airplanes

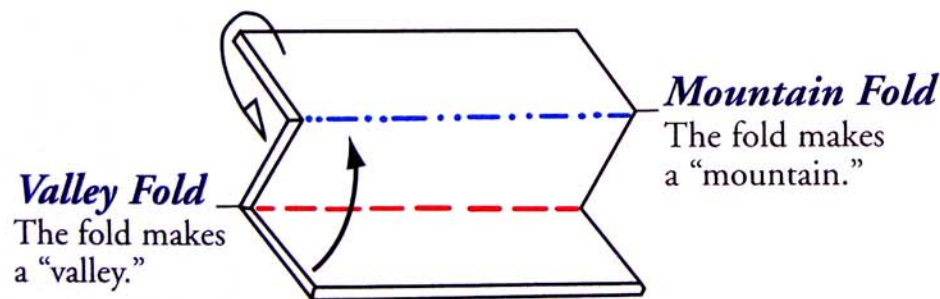
(Keep this instruction page in the back of the calendar for quick reference throughout the year.)

It is important to note that the folding instructions for each plane begin with the tip (or nose) of the plane pointing up. On some patterns, it is not immediately apparent which end of the paper should point up when you start folding. Look for a star (★) to indicate the tip of the plane. Colored fields indicate the side of the page printed with airplane graphics. Be sure to adjust your patterned paper accordingly. You don't want to start folding a plane upside-down! Note: A faded star means the patterned side of the paper is face down.

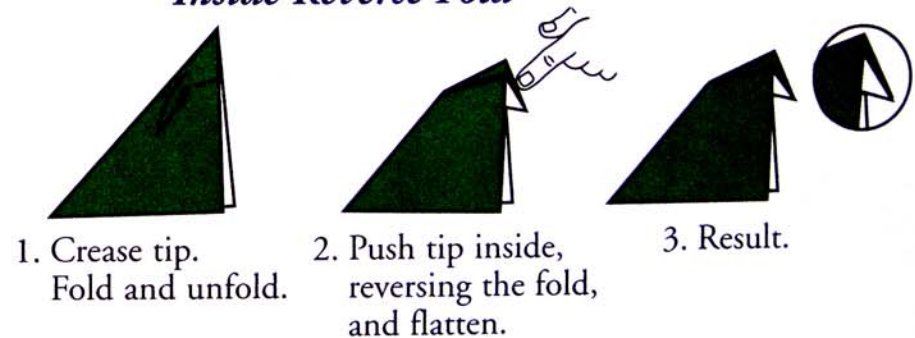
It is also important to look for the arrows on the folding instructions. They will direct you which way to make your folds. Arrows, such as the one in the illustration shown here, will also let you know if you need to make a fold and unfold it.

## *Inside Reverse Fold*



**Here are some important tips to remember when folding the airplanes in this calendar:**

- Due to shifting during the printing process, you may need to trim excess black around the airplane patterns.
- Fold the planes on a clean, flat surface.
- Make very clean, precise folds and creases.
- Always follow the instructions very carefully. Do not skip steps.
- Look ahead to the next step. It will help you to see what your model should look like after completing each step.
- When you get stuck, go back to the previous step. If that doesn't help, go back to the beginning.
